VISION & MISSION

MEALS

- The H.C. Bailey Dining Commons is located in the McCravey-Triplett Student Center. Dining Hours are as follows:
 - Continental Breakfast 6:30 a.m.
 - Hot Breakfast 7:00 a.m. – 8:15 a.m.
 - Lunch 11:30 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.
 - Dinner 4:30 p.m. – 6:30 p.m.
- IDs are required at every meal.
- Access cards will be scanned at each meal.
- Food is to be consumed within the dining area.
- Carryout meals are not allowed.

RESIDENCE HALLS

- Residence halls have typical college dormitory rooms with twin beds that require extra-long sheets.
- Individuals are liable for all damages to the residence halls and its equipment.
- Each resident will be issued 1 room key and 1 building access card. There is a \$10.00 fine for each lost key or card, and also for keys and cards not returned at the time of checkout.
- Furniture and/or beds are not to be moved.
- Common courtesy should be given concerning noise in one's room.
- Each individual is responsible for the cleanliness of his/her room.
- Each residence hall has beverage and food vending machines. These machines only accept US currency.
- Please dress properly at all times when entering the halls or lobbies of the residence halls.
- For the benefit of your safety and other guests, DO NOT open the emergency exit doors for persons to enter the building. Do not place objects of any kind to prop open doors. These are EMERGENCY DOORS ONLY. The front entrance is accessible 24 hours per day with your access card. Persons who violate this order will be reprimanded to the fullest extent (which may lead to your dismissal from the International Ballet Dance School). **Remember: This is for your protection!**

LAUNDRY FACILITIES

- Each residence hall has coin operated laundry facilities available to the International Ballet Dance School. These machines only accept US currency. Washer: \$1.50 per load. Dryer: \$1.50 for 60 minutes of drying. (Subject to change).

WIRELESS INTERNET ACCESS

- Wireless internet is available in all buildings on campus.
- To access the internet using a wireless connection, please connect to the BU-Student network and open your browser (IE, Firefox, Safari, Chrome, etc.). No user name or password is required.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Dance school participants and IBC affiliated personnel must wear their ID badges at all times.
- Access cards will be issued which will allow access to residence hall and will also be scanned at each meal.
- Postage stamps may be purchased in the Mail Room which is located on the 2nd floor of the McCravey-Triplett Student Center.
- An ATM machine is located under the stairway in the McCravey-Triplett Student Center.

THE FOLLOWING ARE PROHIBITED:

- Damaging, destroying, or tampering with Belhaven University property or the property of others.
- Swimming in Belhaven Lake or the Fountain is prohibited.
- Lewd or sexually offensive conduct, including indecent exposure and public nudity, is not permitted on Belhaven campus.
- The use of candles or incense is strictly prohibited.

DRUGS & NARCOTICS

➤ **CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES**

Belhaven University supports the federal and state laws with regard to drug use, possession and distribution. No controlled substance shall be sold, possessed, or used on Belhaven campus. Any person selling, possessing, or using controlled substances shall be subject to penalties including immediate removal from the Belhaven campus and potential dismissal from the International Ballet Competition. The manufacture, use, distribution, sale, offer for sale, or possession of any illegal drug or narcotic including barbiturates, hallucinogens, amphetamines, ecstasy, cocaine, heroin, opium, marijuana or other controlled substance except as prescribed by a physician is prohibited. (Possession is defined as being in the immediate area, room, vehicle, house, on one's person, etc.)

➤ **ALCOHOL**

Guests may not sell, possess, or consume alcoholic beverages on the campus, on the premises of any organization granted recognition by Belhaven University, or any university-related event. (Possession is defined as being in the immediate area, room, vehicle, house, on one's person, etc.)

➤ **TOBACCO**

In the interest of promoting a healthy living environment for all of the Belhaven University community, the use of tobacco in any form is prohibited on the campus, including buildings, parking lots, lawns, and sidewalks, as well as at all University sponsored events. Prohibited products include, but are not limited to, cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, snuff, and pipe tobacco.

FIRE AND EMERGENCY EVACUATION

- Guests are required to exit the building immediately any time the fire alarm sounds.
- Guests should become familiar with the fire exits in each section of the residence halls.
- Exterior fire doors will be closed and locked at all times and are not for use except for emergency only.
- Interior stairwell doors should remain closed at all times.
- Charts indicating the proper procedures are posted in each hall.
- Guests are to evacuate the building immediately and stay at least 50 feet away from the building until the "all clear" signal from an appropriate staff member.

TORNADOES

- If a TORNADO WATCH is issued, Campus Security will notify the residence hall staff in each residence hall.
- In the event of a TORNADO WARNING residents should proceed at once in an orderly fashion to a pre-selected area of safety on the ground floor or basement and remain in the designated area until authorization to leave is confirmed by a Belhaven University official.
